

Role: Project Director (part time)

The Open Food Network is a global network of people and organizations working together to develop open and shared resources, knowledge and software to support sustainable, ethical, and inclusive food systems.

We are looking for skilled, values-aligned team members who will contribute to our work and help us achieve our vision for a world where fair, open food & farming networks reconnect people and regenerate the earth. Our national and global teams have always worked remotely and we don't see that changing in the future, though we look forward to meeting up once in a while in person again one day. Work in the Open Food Network USA is currently mostly volunteer or pro bono, but the global organization uses an equitable pay scale and our goal is to provide appropriate financial compensation to all contributors as soon as possible. This role will be partially compensated on a contract/1099 basis - rate, employment type, and hours per week are flexible and depend on projects and funding.
